There is a meeting coming up that will address off-road vehicle use in our area.

BLM is holding an open-house meeting on **Wed, April 19 from 5:30pm to 6:30pm at** the Yucca Valley Community Center to review their proposal to temporarily restrict off-road vehicle use to street legal vehicles ONLY on BLM segments within roadways maintained by the County.

The BLM's proposed temporary limit would NOT prohibit off-road vehicle travel on community roads NOT maintained by the County.

BLM to hold route system meetings for public input

Dear MBCA Members and Supporters,

MBCA keeps you informed about off-road vehicle issues impacting our rural neighborhoods and wilderness areas. As many of you are aware, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is in the process of revising their WEMO (West Mojave) Route System.

MBCA along with conservation partners COW (Citizens OHV Watch) and ARR (Alliance for Responsible Recreation) hold the position that it is unacceptable for the BLM to utilize our community roadways within their OHV route system. We advocate that BLM routes starting, terminating and otherwise utilizing community residential roadways should be designated for street legal vehicle use only.

It appears our voices have been heard and are being considered by the BLM in planning for the route system revision. However, it is important for us to continue our advocacy to insure the outcomes we are working for. BLM will be hosting two open-house meetings to gather public input on a proposal to temporarily restrict use to street legal vehicles ONLY on the 148 miles of roadways located on BLM route segments located within a CSA and maintained by the County of San Bernardino Public Works Department. However, if you live on a community road that is NOT a County maintained roadway, the BLM's proposed temporary limit would NOT prohibit OHV travel on those roadways.

While MBCA supports the BLM's proposal to temporarily limit usage on their routes that incorporate County maintained roadways to street legal only vehicles, BLM must provide protections for all residential roads whether or not they are County maintained. Your voices will be important for BLM to hear to endorse street legal only designation and to expand it to include similar protections for all our rural residential roadways.
